

It is alleged that Ms. Van Arkel contravened by act or omission the *Regulated Health Professions Act, 1991*, the *Dental Hygiene Act, 1991*, or the regulations thereunder and engaged in conduct that was unbecoming a dental hygienist, was disgraceful, dishonourable or unprofessional in that it is alleged that she engaged in the practice of the profession while her ability to do so was impaired by a substance; and/or failed to reply appropriately and responsively to the College within the time specified (or, if no time is specified, within 30 days to a written inquiry made by the College that requests a response); and/or failed to cooperate with a College investigator.

A hearing respecting allegations against Ms. Van Arkel was scheduled to be heard on January 26, 2015. However, as Ms. Van Arkel's certificate of registration had been revoked due to non-payment of fees, a Panel of the Discipline Committee agreed to adjourn the disciplinary proceedings against her indefinitely.
